

The Town of Sturgeon Bay called its monthly Town Board meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. on Monday, February 1, 2021, at the Arle Memorial Hall (Former Knights of Columbus Hall), Chairman Dan Cihlar presiding. Masking was required and social distancing by 6 ft. was put into practice.

Roll call indicated the following Board members present: Chairman Dan Cihlar, Supervisor Paul Skup, Supervisor Carol Schuster, Clerk Nancy Anschutz and Treasurer Lynne Gustafson.

Meeting Minutes from the January 2021 meeting were read. A motion was made by Supervisor Skup, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Chairman Cihlar to approve the minutes as amended.

Treasurer Gustafson gave the following report:

### **Old Business:**

Roads/Signs : Chairman Cihlar responded to a question from Katie Winkert regarding posts installed at Chippewa Drive. Posts were put in to prevent 4-wheelers and or vehicles from entering the right of way to the water.

### **New Business:**

Clerk Anschutz reported she is working with DC Soil and Water regarding the treatment of invasives. Contact will be made with three local certified applicators. There are approximately five areas in need of treatment. Permission slips will be sent to property owners identified as having invasives prior to any treatment visits.

### **County Board Update** presented by Sue Kohout:

Recognized Erin Tauscher for service to County Board,  
Asking State to increase funding for ADRC's,  
Acceptance of County CARES grant for election expenses,  
Accept DNR funding of \$12,371.23 for purpose of aquatic invasive species study,  
Accept grant from DNR for Twin Harbor Creek Headwater Protection project,  
Accept financial assistance for kayak launch at Robert M. Carmody County Park,  
Authorized funds for parking lot and sidewalk repairs at Chaudoir's Dock Park,  
Approved lease agreement for brine making equipment,  
Authorization to proceed with Phase II for County facility on Washington Island project for emergency services and other county functions.  
Request from Chris Jeanquart to rezone 374 sq. ft. on his property was approved,  
Request for zoning change of 6.65 acre on 18<sup>th</sup> Ave by Richard Wilke for storage facility was denied because testimony was different than stated in application.

**Public Discussion** – Rose Hayes reported they are proceeding with having Crommel’s Grove surveyed.
