

The Town of Sturgeon Bay called its monthly Town Board meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. on Monday, March 7, 2022 at the Arle Memorial Hall (Former Knights of Columbus Hall), Chairman Dan Cihlar presiding.

Roll call indicated the following Board members present: Chairman Dan Cihlar, Supervisor Carol Schuster, Supervisor Paul Skup, Treasurer Lynne Gustafson, and Clerk Nancy Anschutz.

Meeting Minutes from the February meeting were read. A motion was made by Chairman Cihlar, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Supervisor Skup, to approve the minutes as read.

Treasurer Gustafson gave the following report:

Supervisor Skup made a motion to approve the Treasurers Report, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Supervisor Schuster.

### **Old Business:**

#### Roads/Signs :

The two logs in the right-of-way on Silverdale have been removed.

The new culvert installed on Mount Olive is sinking. The County Hwy. Dept. will correct iwhen the weather permits.

Chairman Cihlar reported the PCI signs on west end of Silverdale Rd will be fixed and replaced when weather permits.

The 2022 Annual Road Tour has been tentatively scheduled for 7:00 a.m. on Saturday, April 23<sup>rd</sup>, departing from 1976 Cty. Rd U.

Zoning/Permit Issues – None

DC Humane Society – No activity report.

Broadband Expansion Application – The Town will submit an application, along with five other municipalities for a grant with Charter/Spectrum for broadband service. A motion was made by Chairman Cihlar to pledge \$100.00 per address as identified by Charter. Supervisor Skup 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. Monies will come from the ARPA funds if application is accepted.

### **New Business:**

The town reached out to Attorney Randy Nesbitt regarding letters from Rich Propsom dated January 3, and January 16, 2022. Mr. Propsom asked the town to have items removed on South Dretzer Blvd, an unimproved right of way in Cromell's Grove. Attorney Nesbitt advised the Town Board has the discretion to act, or not act upon future use of that land as it sees fit.

Two IOH permits were issued to Gilbert Farms for 2022.

Clerk Anschutz reported the Wisconsin Elections Commission approved an Election Security .gov email/domain grant up to \$600.00. Request for reimbursement must be submitted no later than August 31, 2022. Anschutz will begin getting quotes for this transition.

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**County Board (CB) Update** - Representative Sue Kohout reported on the latest County Board activity, including:

- Recognized Maggie Weir for 39 years of service to the DC Historical Museum;
- Transfer \$20K to cover witness fees in the criminal case of Richard Pierce;
- Transfer 35K toward housing for sexually violent persons, DC is obligated by the state to provide supervised housing;
- Transfer \$155K to construct a small building for the county's salt brining operation;
- Resolution pledging \$25 per address for the BB application six municipalities are submitting to Charter/Spectrum if application is accepted;
- Resolution approving ARPA funds toward housing, broadband, environmental, health and human services and public health.

**Public Discussion –**

Darrick DeMeuse reported candidates for County Board seats will be introduced by the League of Women Voters and video will be available for viewing on their website.

**Other Correspondence –** Clerk Anschutz advised she will order the 2022 BOR video for viewing by the town board members.

Following the review and payment of bills, a motion was made by Supervisor Schuster, 2nd by Supervisor Skup, to adjourn at 8:45 p.m.
