

The Town of Sturgeon Bay called its monthly Board meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. on Monday, April 6, 2020, at the Arle Memorial Hall (Former Knights of Columbus Hall), Chairman Dan Cihlar presiding. Social distancing by 6 ft. was put into practice.

Roll call indicated the following Board members present: Chairman Dan Cihlar, Supervisor Carol Schuster, Supervisor Paul Skup and Clerk Nancy Anschutz.

Meeting Minutes from the March meeting were read. A motion was made by Supervisor Schuster, 2nd by Chairman Cihlar to approve the minutes as read.

Supervisor Skup made a motion to approve the Treasurers Report, 2nd by Chairman Cihlar.

Old Business:

Roads/Signs - Concerns raised about the discharge of water onto roadway from a residence on SLMD.

Erosion Control/Concerns: Culvert starting to get plugged again on SLMD. Chairman Cihlar checking with the WDNR to see what is allowed and who is responsible. The culvert near 1957 South Lake Michigan Drive has been cleaned once.

The 2020 Annual Road Tour is scheduled for Thursday, April 16th, starting at 7:00 a.m. from 1976 Cty. Road U. Due to the COVID-19 restrictions, persons attending will travel in separate vehicles.

Walking path on Winnebago Drive: David Wood called into the meeting via phone. He expressed concerns about the ever rising waters of Lake Michigan, endangering his property and that of his neighbors. He asked permission to again use Winnebago Drive as an access if it becomes necessary. The Board made it clear the public has voiced dissatisfaction over the rough state Winnebago Drive is currently in. Mr. Wood agreed to replace the stone barrier for the parking area. He also agreed to cover the area with 2+ inches of quarry wash stones and compact to enable foot traffic but leave a staging area if/when needed. It was understood and agreed by all that the area needs to be restored for public use.

No Zoning/Permit Issues: None

New Business:

IOH Permits – Annual IOH Permits were signed for Rio Creek Feed Mill and Gilbert Farms.

Burning Ban – The DNR issued a No Burn ban. Spring is a dangerous time of year with all the dried vegetation and with the current COVID-19 issue, first responders and fire departments have to be available for assistance as needed.

County Board Update presented by Sue Kohout:

There are six positive cases of COVID-19 in Door County as of 4/6/20.

Staff changes expected for response to the Coronavirus Pandemic.

Other Correspondence – Clerk Anschutz asked if the 2020 Annual Meeting scheduled for April 20th could be adjourned and rescheduled for Monday, May 18th to follow suit with what other towns are doing. Board agreed.
