Roads/Signs –

- The Town was notified that the Tagge Road resurfacing project initially scheduled to be done by Northeast Asphalt in June will be delayed until August. Reason being NEA had two major projects this summer and will be hauling a large amount of material from their Tagge Road quarry. The delay will ensure the added heavy truck traffic takes place prior to the resurfacing. There will be no price change.
- Roadside garbage on Buffalo Ridge Trail will be picked up by the County.
- Fahrner Asphalt Sealers expect to spray patch the potholes on South Lake Michigan Drive the middle of June.

County Board Update: Sue Kohout reported on the following County Board activity.

- Phase 3 of the Cana Island Project – five items put out to bid all came in very high, double in most cases – access due to high water more than likely the reason for these increases.
- House on Michigan Street owned by the Museum and used for storage will need to be removed. Property will be kept.
- Transportation Program – will keep for next 3 years but will assign one person to oversee the program and funding.
- Friends of Parks – held a dedication for Tornado Park.
