

The Town of Sturgeon Bay called its monthly Town Board meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. on Monday, September 7, 2020, at the Arle Memorial Hall (Former Knights of Columbus Hall), Chairman Dan Cihlar presiding. Masking was required and social distancing by 6 ft. was put into practice.

Roll call indicated the following Board members present: Chairman Dan Cihlar, Supervisor Carol Schuster, Supervisor Paul Skup, Treasurer Lynne Gustafson and Clerk Nancy Anschutz.

Meeting Minutes from the August meeting were read. A motion was made by Chairman Cihlar, 2nd by Supervisor Skup to approve the minutes as read.

Winnebago Right-of-way: Pete Schuster volunteered to bring the orange mesh and treated lumber out to the main road and Chairman Cihlar will have the County pick it up.

Supervisor Schuster reported Chippewa Right-of-way currently in good condition.

Chairman Cihlar will ask the County to remove tree branches on Buffalo Ridge Trail. He will provide map of designated area.

Sturgeon Blvd – Continued discussion:

Rose Hayes asked if the town would help financially with a survey and legal services for the Crommels Grove plots. Following discussion, the Board stated they did not want to not establish a precedence because they have not done this in the past, therefore responded with a no.

Lily Bay County Park lies more in the Town of Sturgeon Bay than Sevastopol. This park has been used more in 2020 than past years, therefore the County will put up some signs outlining rules regarding parking.
