

**TOWN OF STURGEON BAY**  
**2013 Annual Meeting**

The 2013 Annual Meeting for the Town of Sturgeon Bay was called to order by Chairman Dan Cihlar at 7:30 p.m., Monday, April 22, 2013 at the Knights of Columbus Hall. Board members present: Chairman Dan Cihlar, Supervisor Paul Skup, *newly elected* Supervisor Carol Schuster, Treasurer Lynne Gustafson and Clerk Nancy Anschutz.

Minutes of the 2012 Annual Meeting were read. Susan Kohout made a motion to approve the minutes as read, seconded by Nancy Munch. Motion was approved and carried.

- 1) The 2012 Financial Report was reviewed. A motion was made by Robert Kohout, seconded by Pete Schuster to approve the Financial Report for 2012. Motion was approved and carried.
- 2) Bank Depository – Caryn Wickman made a motion, seconded by Lynne Gustafson to continue with Baylake Bank as the primary financial depository. Motion was approved and carried.
- 3) A motion was made by Robert Kohout, seconded by Pete Schuster to continue using the Door County Advocate / Gannet for publishing special meeting notices for town business in 2013. In 2014, costs should be compared for both the DC Advocate and Peninsula Pulse. Motion was approved and carried.
- 4) Susan Kohout made a motion, seconded by Robyn Anderson, that the next Annual Meeting will be held at 7:30 p.m. on Monday, April 21, 2014. Motion was approved and carried.
- 5) Chairman Cihlar reviewed highlights from 2012.
- 6) County Board Representative Susan Kohout has created an email list for people interested in updates on county board activities. Contact Sue direct if you wish to be added to her email list.

Other items discussed included:

Susan Kohout reported on the new ADRC (Aging & Disability Resource Center), which began on Jan 1, 2013. This center offers the general public a single source for information and assistance on issues affecting older people (age 60 and older).

Lynne Gustafson spoke on behalf of Judy Meyers who could not attend said meeting. The Meyers own property adjacent to the Jeff Annoye property on the corner of Silverdale and Cty. Rd. U. A motion was made by Chairman Cihlar, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Supervisor Skup to have the clerk send a letter to the Planning Dept. and copy the building inspector about safety concerns raised on the Annoye property. Residents feel the large hole (future basement) is not safe and the area in general is unsightly to neighbors.

A motion to adjourn at 8:25 p.m. was made by John Munch, seconded by Pete Schuster. Motion was approved and carried.
