

TOWN OF STURGEON BAY

2018 Annual Meeting

The 2018 Annual Meeting for the Town of Sturgeon Bay was called to order by Chairman Dan Cihlar at 7:00 p.m., Monday, April 23, 2018 at the Knights of Columbus Hall. Board members present: Chairman Dan Cihlar, Supervisor Carol Schuster, Supervisor Paul Skup, Treasurer Lynne Gustafson and Clerk Nancy Anschutz.

Minutes from the 2017 Annual Meeting were read. Sue Kohout made a motion to approve the minutes as read, seconded by Kris Peterson. Motion was approved and carried.

- 1) The 2017 Financial Report was reviewed. Following discussion, a motion was made by Kris Peterson, seconded by Sue Behrens to approve the Financial Report for 2017. Motion was approved and carried.
- 2) Bank Depository – Lynne Gustafson made a motion, seconded by Kris Peterson to continue with Nicolet Bank as the primary financial depository. Motion was approved and carried.
- 3) A motion was made by Lynne Gustafson, seconded by Sue Behrens to use the least expensive publication between the Door County Advocate / Gannet or the DC Pulse for publishing special meeting notices for town business in 2018. Motion was approved and carried.
- 4) Sue Behrens made a motion, seconded by Kris Peterson, that the next Annual Meeting be held at 7:00 p.m. on Monday, April 22, 2019. Motion was approved and carried.

Other items discussed included:

- Sturgeon Bay Fire Chief Tim Dietman presented the 2017 Fire Dept. Annual Report. The Fire Dept. responded to a total of 48 calls in our town in 2017, of which 27 were emergency medical assist. The remaining 21 varied from grass fires, water rescue and miscellaneous public assist. Fire protection cost was \$88,604.50 in 2017.
- Chairman Cihlar reported the City of Sturgeon Bay will allow town residents to purchase permits to drop off brush and grass at their compost site on Division Road at a cost of \$100.00 for the year. Parties should check with SB Park Dept. located on 14th Ave. to confirm rates to pick up compost.
- Lisa Bieri spoke on behalf of Sevastopol School Board. A survey will be mailed to residents in the Sevastopol school district seeking public opinion about updating their out dated school.
- A considerable amount of time was spent discussing the town's ordinance to regulate noxious weeds and invasive species, primarily focusing on the control/treatment of phragmites. Krista Lutzke from Soil and Water and Jason Wilke (professional for treating invasives) described the program and were available to answer any questions.

A motion to adjourn at 8:35 p.m. was made by Kris Peterson, seconded by Sue Behrens. Motion was approved and carried.
