

## **TOWN OF STURGEON BAY 2020 Annual Meeting**

The 2020 Annual Meeting for the Town of Sturgeon Bay was called to order by Chairman Dan Cihlar at 7:00 p.m., Monday, August 17, 2020 at the Arle Memorial Hall. Board members present: Chairman Dan Cihlar, Supervisor Paul Skup, Treasurer Lynne Gustafson and Clerk Nancy Anschutz. Supervisor Carol Schuster was absent,

Minutes from the 2019 Annual Meeting were read. Lynne Gustafson made a motion to approve the minutes as read, seconded by Sue Kohout. Motion was approved and carried.

- 1) The 2019 Financial Report was reviewed. Following discussion, a motion was made by Sue Kohout, seconded by Bill Utley to approve the Financial Report for 2019. Motion was approved and carried.
- 2) Bank Depository – Lynne Gustafson made a motion, seconded by Bill Utley to continue with Nicolet Bank as the primary financial depository. Motion was approved and carried.
- 3) A motion was made by Lynne Gustafson, seconded by Bill Utley to use the Peninsula Pulse for publishing special meeting notices for town business in 2020. Motion was approved and carried.
- 4) Sue Kohout made a motion, seconded by Lynne Gustafson, that the next Annual Meeting be held at 7:00 p.m. on Monday, April 19, 2021. Motion was approved and carried.

Other items discussed included:

Sturgeon Bay Assistant Fire Chief Kalin Montevideo presented the 2019 Annual Report for the SB Fire Dept. The Fire Dept. responded to a total of 53 calls in our town in 2019, of which 35 were emergency and/or medical assist. The remaining 18 varied from grass fires, water rescue and miscellaneous public assist. Fire protection cost in 2019 was \$89,958.20. The Sturgeon Bay Fire Dept is rated as ISO Class 2.

Samantha Koyen from DC Soil and Water reported on treatment for invasives, including Japanese Knotweed, Wild Parsnip and Phragmites and her department mailed permission slips to treat these invasives. The town has approximately 5 acres of phragmites and will use grant money to treat as permitted. They will not trespass on private property.

Ms. Koyen also advised DC Soil and Water is working with the UW Oshkosh to test private wells for contamination of groundwater. Cost to well owners is \$30.00, with more extensive testing available for an additional \$25.00. Sample drop offs will take place on Oct. 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup>.

A motion to adjourn at 7:55 p.m. was made by Sue Kohout seconded by Bill Utley. Motion was approved and carried.
