

TOWN OF STURGEON BAY 2021 Annual Meeting

The 2021 Annual Meeting for the Town of Sturgeon Bay was called to order by Chairman Dan Cihlar at 7:00 p.m., on Monday, April 19, 2021 at the Arle Memorial Hall. Board members present: Chairman Dan Cihlar, Supervisor Paul Skup, Supervisor Carol Schuster, Treasurer Lynne Gustafson and Clerk Nancy Anschutz.

Minutes from the 2020 Annual Meeting were read. Lynne Gustafson made a motion to approve the minutes as read, seconded by Rose Hayes. Motion was approved and carried.

- 1) The 2020 Financial Report was reviewed. Following discussion, a motion was made by Sue Kohout, seconded by Lynne Gustafson to approve the Financial Report for 2020. Motion was approved and carried.
- 2) Bank Depository – Lynne Gustafson made a motion, seconded by Rose Hayes to continue with Nicolet Bank as the primary financial depository. Motion was approved and carried.
- 3) A motion was made by Robert Kohout, seconded by Lynne Gustafson to continue using the Peninsula Pulse for publishing special meeting notices for town business in 2021. Motion was approved and carried.
- 4) Rose Hayes made a motion, seconded by Sue Kohout, that the next Annual Meeting be held at 7:00 p.m. on Monday, April 18, 2022. Motion was approved and carried.

Other items discussed included:

- Sturgeon Bay Assistant Fire Chief Kalin Montevideo presented the 2020 Annual Report for the SB Fire Dept. The Fire Dept. responded to a total of 59 calls in our town in 2020, of which 39 were emergency and/or medical assist. The remaining 20 varied from fires and miscellaneous public assist. Fire protection cost in 2020 was \$90,669.70. Clerk Anschutz asked if Air B&B's and Bed and Breakfast's (B&B's) are inspected. B&B's are because they are identified as a business, Air B&B's are not because they are not always known. Clerk Anschutz also asked about a bill received from SBU's for water taken from a city hydrant to fight a fire in our town. This was the first time such a bill was received. Asst. Chief Montevideo said she provides a monthly report to SBU regarding water usage and will provide a copy of that report to the town monthly.
- Rose Hayes advised the Board they have treated bamboo on Sturgeon Blvd and planted blackberries in an attempt to wipe out the invasive.

A motion to adjourn at 7:45 p.m. was made by Robert Kohout seconded by Rose Hayes. Motion was approved and carried.
