

The Town of Sturgeon Bay called its monthly Board meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. on Monday, June 1, 2020, at the Arle Memorial Hall (Former Knights of Columbus Hall), Chairman Dan Cihlar presiding. Social distancing by 6 ft. was put into practice.

Roll call indicated the following Board members present: Chairman Dan Cihlar, Supervisor Carol Schuster, Supervisor Paul Skup, and Clerk Nancy Anschutz.

Meeting Minutes from the May meeting were read. A motion was made by Supervisor Skup, 2nd by Chairman Cihlar to approve the minutes as read.

Chairman Cihlar made a motion to approve the Treasurers Report, 2nd by Supervisor Skup.

### **Old Business:**

Roads/Signs - Fahrner has completed chip sealing on Taube Road. Fahrner expects to have left over chip seal material after section of Silverdale is done and has offered to the town for an additional cost of \$5,700.00. Chairman Cihlar made a motion, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Supervisor Skup to go forward with the additional cost of \$5,700.00 to chip seal Silverdale Road west of Shiloh (dead end) and if left over material still remains, put it down on Shiloh Lane.

It was reported there is a good size hole on Buffalo Ridge Trail – Chairman Cihlar to check. May be result of a wash out.

Fahrner expects to do spray patching on South Lake Michigan Drive in mid June.

Erosion Control/Concerns: No immediate concerns at this time. Water on the road in front of the Leonardson property has subsided.

Zoning/Permit Issues: None

### **New Business:**

Sturgeon Blvd – Length / Measurement Questioned: Rich Propsom currently owns a lot in Cromell's Grove and uses Sturgeon Blvd as an access to said lot. He states there are several signs on this road such as "no trespassing, private road and a stop sign". Mr. Propsom feels the town is not claiming ownership of the entire road, therefore not getting all the road aids the town is entitled to.

Clerk Anschutz got a quote to survey Sturgeon Blvd at a cost of \$700 to \$800. Tony Hayes who also owns several lots in Cromell's Grove stated his opposition to such a survey. Following a lengthy discussion, Mr. Propsom offered to talk with the parties of Dennis & Rose Hayes privately in an attempt to come to a mutual resolution. This item will be back on the July 2020 town board agenda.

**New Business continued:**

The 2020 Annual Meeting that was re-scheduled for May 18<sup>th</sup> was canceled due to the COVID-19 Stay-at-Home Order extension. That meeting was rescheduled for Monday, August 17, 2020, starting at 7:00 p.m. Clerk Anschutz will post publicly closer to that date.

A motion was made by Chairman Cihlar, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Supervisor Schuster, to pass a resolution to move the second installment of property taxes from July 31<sup>st</sup> to October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2020. Reason for this delayed payment primarily due to economic hardships caused by the COVID-19 Pandemic giving property owners and the County's business community an opportunity to get back on their feet.

Chairman Cihlar made a motion, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Supervisor Skup to renew the liquor licenses for both the 27 Pines Golf Course and the Door County Rod and Gun Club.
