

The Town of Sturgeon Bay called its monthly meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. on Monday, June 4, 2012 at the Knights of Columbus Hall, Chairman Cihlar presiding.

Roll call indicated the following Board members present: Chairman Dan Cihlar, Supervisor Harry Porter, Supervisor Paul Skup, and Clerk Nancy Anschutz.

Minutes from May's meeting were read. A motion to approve the minutes as corrected was made by Supervisor Porter, 2nd by Chairman Cihlar.

Old Business:

Road Work -

The County asked about grass cutting – the Board feels first cut should be to the fence in 2nd part of June.

Fahrner is done with crack sealing on Mt. Olive and Lake Lane. Spray patching is expected to be done by the end of June.

A complaint was received from a resident on North Lake Michigan Drive about a culvert heaving the asphalt on one end. Chairman Cihlar will call Fahrner and ask them to look at it and make a recommendation.

Chairman Cihlar working with DC Hwy. Commissioner John Kolodziej to transfer LRIP funds to the Lily Bay Road project – money available is \$9,000.00. A Request for Bids will be posted.

The Land Trust reported our town has one of the healthiest populations in DC of the Dune Thistle. The Nap weed is the biggest threat to this thistle. The Land Trust plans to monitor and treat as necessary to preserve this endangered thistle.

Review Building Inspection Services -

Brett Temme from Independent Inspections gave an overview of the services they offer; they service 100 communities throughout the state. They have 5 inspectors stationed in DC; 3 primary and 2 part time inspectors. Inspections fees are paid directly to the town; town then makes payment at end of each month. They presented their fee scale, capability to issue various reports and testimony of customers. The Board asked this topic be put back on the agenda for the July meeting.
