

The Town of Sturgeon Bay called its monthly meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. on Monday, February 3, 2014 at the Knights of Columbus Hall, Chairman Dan Cihlar presiding.

Roll call indicated the following Board members present: Chairman Dan Cihlar, Supervisor Paul Skup, Supervisor Carol Schuster and Clerk Nancy Anschutz.

Minutes from January's meeting were read. A motion to approve the minutes as corrected was made by Chairman Cihlar, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Supervisor Skup.

**Old Business:**

Roads/Signs –

- Chairman Cihlar met with Tony Depies, City Engineer for City of Sturgeon Bay to discuss reconstruction of 18<sup>th</sup> Avenue. The town is responsible for 1,020 ft. of the work. The City of Sturgeon Bay will figure the cost to replace our share (1,020 ft.), done to our standards.
- The town was asked to have driveway plowed for Joyce Schranz on Shiloh Road. The private snowplow contractor could not get in with their equipment and it was necessary to open for fuel delivery. Ms. Schranz will be billed for this one time assistance.
- Two signs have been replaced: A road name sign at intersection of Cty. U and Lake Lane and a stop ahead sign on Sand Lane, north of Silverdale Rd.

**New Business:**

- A) Representatives from the DC Environmental Council asked if the Town of Sturgeon Bay would like to participate in a voluntary well testing this summer. Three options would be available to town residents. Costs range from \$42.00 to \$110.00 per well test and would be the responsibility of the individual homeowner. Test results are confidential and will not be made public. There will be a \$500.00 advertising promotion available to each participating town. Collection dates and sites to be arranged by the town and transport of the water samples could be shared with one or more municipalities. This item will be on the March agenda.
