

The Town of Sturgeon Bay called its monthly meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. on Monday, February 6, 2017, at the Knights of Columbus Hall, Chairman Dan Cihlar presiding.

Roll call indicated the following Board members present: Chairman Dan Cihlar, Supervisor Carol Schuster, Supervisor Paul Skup, and Clerk Nancy Anschutz.

Meeting minutes from January's meeting were read. A motion to approve the minutes as read was made by Chairman Cihlar, 2nd by Supervisor Skup.

Treasurer's report:

A motion to approve the Treasurer's Report was made by Supervisor Skup, 2nd by Supervisor Schuster.

Old Business:

Roads/Signs –

Nothing to report. Board members received an updated "contact list" from the County.

Zoning/Permit Issues –

If anyone wants a copy of the "updated" Door County Shoreland Zoning Ordinance, they should let Clerk Anschutz know.

New Business:

Krista Lutzke from DC Soil/Water Conservation Dept again attended town board meeting to answer questions about the Town's Ordinance regulating noxious weeds and invasive species. She stated their dept will continue educational and outreach programs as funding permits. It is up to the Board to administer said ordinance. A group of volunteer "champions" will continue to do the inventory. It was suggested a copy of the said ordinance be mailed to all property owners with their annual tax bills.

The biennial Door/Kewaunee Legislative Days is planned for April 5 & 6 in Madison. A request for financial support was received, however, no monies were budgeted. This group also asked for suggestions of issues they could take to Madison that could benefit our area. A suggestion was made to request additional funding to support invasive species control and management projects. Clerk Anschutz will forward that suggestion.

The Board asked Clerk Anschutz to contact WTA to get their opinion if we could charge a fee for haulers who travel town roads, based on weight from dredging material. WTA responded "there is no legal authority to force such a payment. Some companies enter voluntary road use agreements and agree to pay for damage to roads they use. But these are voluntarily negotiated agreements and not something where you can just adopt an ordinance and force someone to do."

A request was received from Robert Wickman asking permission to restore three boundary corners along Kickapoo Drive. Following discussion, a motion was made by Chairman Cihlar, seconded by Supervisor Schuster to allow Mr. Wickman to proceed with relocating and marking the corners at Kickapoo Drive, provided he is responsible for all associated costs.

County Board Update: Sue Kohout was not available; therefore there was not a County Board report.

Following the review and payment of bills, a motion was made by Chairman Cihlar, 2nd by Supervisor Skup to adjourn at 8:45 p.m. Motion was approved and carried.
