

The Town of Sturgeon Bay called its monthly meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. on Monday, October 6, 2014 at the Knights of Columbus Hall, Chairman Dan Cihlar presiding.

Roll call indicated the following Board members present: Chairman Dan Cihlar, Supervisor Paul Skup, Supervisor Carol Schuster and Clerk Nancy Anschutz.

Meeting minutes from September's meeting were read. A motion to approve the minutes as read was made by Supervisor Skup, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Chairman Cihlar.

A motion to approve the Treasurer's Report was made by Chairman Cihlar, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Supervisor Schuster.

### **Old Business:**

#### Roads/Signs –

- The new 35 MPH speed limit signs are up on Buffalo Ridge Trail, from Mathey to Lake Forest Park Rd.
- Brushing projects for this Fall were discussed. A motion was made by Chairman Cihlar, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Supervisor Skup, to review potential brushing projects with the county and proceed with \$6,000 to \$8,000 worth of work.
- Chairman Cihlar will ask the county when the patch on Silverdale will be done. The county had said earlier they were waiting for the area to settle before blacktopping.
- Clerk Anschutz reminded the board 3 or 4 weight limit signs on Lake Lane and Sand Lane need attention prior to the cold weather. Several are leaning and one covered by vegetation.

#### Zoning/Permit Issues –

- Board reminded about the DC Comprehensive and Farmland Preservation Plan resolution meeting scheduled for Oct. 16<sup>th</sup>, 2:00 p.m. at the government center.

### **New Business:**

Clerk Anschutz reported contact with Attorney Randy Nesbit about a potential manure spraying ordinance. Mr. Nesbit advised there is no requirement to hold a public hearing on this subject. His estimate to draft such an ordinance was about \$750.00 providing he does not have to attend any meetings. A motion was made by Chairman Cihlar, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Supervisor Schuster to ask Attorney Nesbit to proceed with drafting said ordinance. This draft is expected to be ready for the November meeting.

A letter from Little Hoppers, a local garbage hauler was received and read. They are aware of the towns concern for potential road damage from their equipment and procedures. Little Hoppers advised they *"have implemented changes to further eliminate and preclude any damage to the town's roadways"*. They go on to say *"their current vehicle will be replaced when the route size increases in the near future"*.

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A report from the DC Humane Society was reviewed. In the first eight months of 2014, Jan. through August, animals received from within the Town of Sturgeon Bay are: 5 stray dogs; 4 surrendered dogs; 11 stray cats; and 10 surrendered cats for a total of 30 animals. A motion was made by Supervisor Schuster, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Chairman Cihlar to continue with our \$500.00 annual donation.

Patti Vickman, Superintendent of SD Schools gave a short presentation about their upcoming referendum. She described the schools current situation and how their money is spent.

**County Board Activity:**

Sue Kohout gave an update on current County Board activities. The following four resolutions were discussed:

- The Cave at Horseshoe Bay,
- Intergovernmental Agreement with Brown County for medical examiner services,
- Annual payment to DC Economic Development Corp.,
- The State's transportation referendum which will be on the Nov. 4<sup>th</sup> ballot

**Public Discussion:**

The Knuepfel family extended their appreciation for moving the path at the Canal Park to divert foot traffic off their property.

There will be a clean sweep recycling program on Saturday, Nov. 8<sup>th</sup> at the DC Hwy. Dept. List of items accepted and/or not acceptable will be posted in the town's message box at the KC Hall.

The public is invited to an open house on Tuesday, Oct. 21<sup>st</sup> from 3:30 to 5:30 at the DC Hwy. dept. building in honor of their 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary.

Clerk Anschutz provided board members with the latest incident report from the Sheriff's office, which covered May thru August.

Following the review and payment of bills, a motion was made by Chairman Cihlar, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Supervisor Schuster to adjourn at 8:55 p.m. Motion was approved and carried.
